This letter provides you with the updated details of Term 2 Weighted Assessment (WA2).

Assessment, weighted or non-weighted, is integral to your child/ward's learning process and provides feedback to help move your child/ward's learning forward. It enables him/her to take ownership of his/her learning and develop as a self-directed learner. Your child/ward is encouraged to cultivate a habit of consistent and regular revision of his/her work and to avoid last-minute preparation which may cause anxiety and affect overall well- being.

- 1. There will be no make-up papers for students who are absent during the conduct of Weighted Assessments.
- Students who are on medical leave are required to produce medical certificates immediately upon return to school. His/Her marks will be computed accordingly. No marks will be awarded for the subject if no medical certificate is produced. To support students' learning, absentees will be allowed to attempt pen-and-paper WA at home after they return to school.
- 3. Students who are unwell are advised to rest at home.
