3. School Hours

The flag-raising ceremony will begin daily at **7.30 a.m. sharp**. We appreciate your support in ensuring that your child reaches school punctually and assembles with his/her class so that he/she can start the school day promptly.

[Please note]: Primary 2 to Primary 6 students will be dismissed earlier at **1.00pm on Wednesday, 3 January and Thursday, 4 January 2023**. The school bus service provider has been informed of the above dismissal timing. Dismissal timings <u>from Friday, 5 January 2024 will be as per normal (indicated in the table above).</u>

For the safety of our students and to prevent overcrowding, we would like to remind parents/caregivers to avoid congregating at the school gates during arrival and dismissal whilst sending and/or waiting for your children.

Unstructured play under the supervision of our teachers is scheduled for all six levels during recesses for students to play and interact with each other in a safe environment. Equipment for unstructured play will be provided by the school.

Daily Snack Break:

A snack break is given to students daily (either before or after their recesses) to have a small bite to tide them over the school day. Students can snack on light and healthy food during this short break in their classrooms. Recommended snack items can include biscuits, bread, cereal (small box), energy bar and fruit (e.g. apple and banana)

General Office Opening Hours:

As a single-session school, the General Office operates between 7.00 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday.

4. Arrangements for First Day of School

All <u>Primary 1 (P1)</u> students will start school from 2 January 2024 (Tuesday). On 2 January, at most one parent/guardian will be allowed to accompany the child into the school canteen to ease him/her into the school. This is to facilitate the onboarding of P1 students.

Primary 2 (P2) to Primary 6 (P6) students will attend school from **3 January 2024 (Wednesday) only**. However, Student Care Centres (SCCs) will be open for enrolled P2 to P6 students in the afternoon of 3 January. Parents/guardians who had requested for care arrangement for your child on the morning of 3 January (reference to Parent Letter dated 16 November 2023), you would have been informed of the arrangements made for your child.

5. Updates on Student Personal Details & Medical Record

We would like you to provide updates on your child's personal details and medical record to your child's Form Teachers by 5 January 2024 if there are any changes to his/her contact details and/or health status. A copy of your child's medical information (doctor's memo or assessment letter) needs to be submitted to your child's Form Teachers, if any.

6. Health Matters

Temperature Taking Exercise

To maintain the school's preparedness to activate its temperature-taking regime, as well as to educate our students to take personal responsibility for their own health and to practise social responsibility, the school will be conducting a temperature-taking exercise on <u>Wednesday</u>, 10 January 2024.

To prepare for the exercise, we will be conducting a pre-exercise check on Oral Digital Thermometers (ODTs). Please ensure that your child brings his/her ODT which is in <u>good working condition</u> to school on **Monday, 8 January 2024** and **Tuesday, 9 January 2024** for pre-exercise checks. Those who need to purchase new ODTs may do so from the school bookshop or any pharmacy.

All P1 students will be issued with an individual ODT on 9 January 2024.

General Well-being

We seek parents' support to keep schools a safe environment for students.

If your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention if necessary. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility (e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups).

We appreciate your support and will continue to work with you closely. Let us all do our part to exercise personal and social responsibility and stay safe.

7. Student Safety and Security

- a. To ensure safety and security of the school environment, we will minimise visitors, including parents, from entering the school. All non-school personnel to report to the security guards at the security post to register for a visitor's pass.
- b. Parents should use communication channels such as phone, email, student handbook or video conferencing platforms to get in touch with school staff. In circumstances where face-to-face

communication is necessary, please make an appointment so that the teachers you wish to meet can make time for you.

- c. As part of our efforts to instil responsibility in our students, parents are advised not to send items that their children may have forgotten to bring to school. We will use these teachable moments to help our children learn to be prepared for their learning, whilst ensuring their overall well-being.
- d. The school main gate will open at 6.30 a.m. from Monday to Friday. If you are driving or walking your child to school, we seek your understanding to arrive at school from 6.30 a.m. onwards. The school premises will close at 6.00 p.m. daily. For parents who need to fetch your children from the school-based Student Care Centre (SCC), you are advised to use the Red Gate before 6.00 p.m. and the Yellow Gate after 6.00 p.m.

Road Safety

Please reinforce good road safety habits in your children. Do remind them to use the zebra crossing outside the school when crossing the road. As part of LTA's continuous efforts in enhancing road safety for students, motorists are to adhere to the speed limit of 40 km/h and below when entering a School Zone. A lower speed environment would provide motorists with more reaction time and this helps to enhance safety of the various road users.

Parents are reminded to adhere to LTA's '<u>No Right Turn' sign outside the school</u> which prohibits motorists from turning right when they exit the school from 6.50 a.m. to 7.30 a.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Parents who are driving to pick your children up from school are to wait for their children at the public car parks at Blk 242/243 or Blk 235/241. Please do not obstruct traffic by parking your vehicles along Pasir Ris Street 21 or along the driveway of Blk 227/228.

We seek your cooperation in observing the traffic rules and continuing to exercise consideration for other road users and our neighbouring community.

Fire Evacuation Drill

Staff and students will evacuate to an internal assembly area. Teachers will be on duty to guide the students and ensure their safety and well-being during the drill.
