The visit to the Cu Chi Tunnels was an eye-opener as our students learnt about how and why the tunnels were built. They also had the chance to go through one of the tunnels and experience how it felt to be in such a small tunnel. At the Cu Chi Agricultural Village, our students had a memorable experience in the paddy field where they were taught how to plant rice from scratch and appreciated the hard work of the farmers.

Our students also enjoyed the interaction with their local buddies from Nguyen Van Troi Primary School. Both the local students and our Pasirians gathered in the school hall to present the performances that they had prepared. This was followed by a singalong session and mass aerobic workout. The students ended the visit with exchanges of gifts and handshakes. It was really heartening to see how friendships were formed between the local students and our Pasirians despite the short period of interaction.

This trip to Vietnam had given our Pasirians an opportunity to learn more about a different way of life and the rich history of one of our ASEAN neighbours. At the same time, new friendships were built amongst our Pasirians as they got to know their schoolmates from different classes better. Despite their differences and being away from home, they were able to overcome the obstacles and work together harmoniously.





# CAMBODIA

How fortunate were the selected P5 students who got to experience one of the Seven Wonders of the World – the Angkor Wat in Siem Reap, Cambodia? As our students admired the sunset against the kingdom of wonder, they reflected on their enriching journey in Cambodia thus far.

From 10 to 13 April 2019, our Pasirians also visited Propeng Po Primary School to interact with their students. It did take a while for our students to warm up to the Khmer children as they quickly found out that they did not have a shared language. However, the patience and joy shown on the faces of both our Pasirians and the Khmer students were priceless as they played uninhibitedly with one another, participating in the games that our students had prepared beforehand. Our Pasirians left the school feeling grateful for all that they have, living in Singapore.

Our Pasirians enjoyed the Phare Circus performance which showcased the lives of the Khmer people. They also visited the landmine museum which displayed the many detonated landmines that had been used in the civil unrest the Cambodians had faced, only up till recently. Having never experienced such devastation, our Pasirians showed great empathy towards the plight of the Khmer.

The trip was educational and had such an impact on our Pasirians as they got to witness the lives and culture of the Cambodian people.



## HEAD PREFECT ELECTION CAMPAIGN

'Cooling-off day'. 'Campaign speeches'. These were some of the key phrases our students picked up in our inaugural Head Prefect Election Campaign this year. The election campaign is an opportunity for our students to make an informed decision on whom they see as a role model to lead them in school.

The P5 Senior prefects, who were interested to run for the election, went through a process of nomination and interviews to be selected to be one of three candidates to run for the election. The three chosen candidates then gave their campaign speeches in front of the whole school. We even had a "cooling-off" day before the whole school voted on Election Day.

On Election Day, all teaching staff and students were given the rights to vote for their choice of the Head Prefect. Polling stations were set up with individual iPads to give the feel of the General Election. Class by class, the students and teachers cast their votes.
